MINISTRY ANNOUNCES EXPANDED FUNDING FOR ORH!



Oak Ridges Hospice was delighted to host a November visit by the Honourable Christine Elliott, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health along with Lindsey Park, MPP for Durham to announce an additional \$600,000 in one-time capital funding to support the construction of three additional beds for ORH, bringing the total number of operational hospice beds to eight.

THE NEED FOR HOSPICE: PAULINE'S STORY



It has been 6 years since my mother passed away, in a place that provided her with the grace, dignity and care she so deserved.

My mom had been ill for 2 years. While some of that time was spent in pain, in surgeries, medicated and in and out of hospitals and doctors' offices, some of her time was spent laughing, hugging, sharing memories and just being with family and close friends.

As mom became weaker and more dependent on others for support and care, she, along with my father, decided she would spend her final days at the Huntsville Algonquin Grace Hospice. She wanted to let her family be her family, without having to look after her ever increasing physical and medical needs so that she could continue focusing on the hugs, laughter and memories.

The support and care mom received in hospice was the most peaceful, respectful and loving care that we as her family could have hoped for. As a patient in hospice, mom was able to focus on herself and her visiting family and close friends, not her illness. As her family, it gave us the peace, comfort and privacy to love our mother, wife and grandmother and to spend focused and sincere time with her when time was so important. We were able to trust completely that mom's medical and physical needs were being cared for with the utmost compassion.

Hospice answered a very special need for my mother and our family that we could not have found anywhere else. It allowed my mom to continue to laugh, cry, share hugs and memories. It allowed her to love and be loved by her family and friends. Hospice was her home away from home. It was the supportive, peaceful and caring place mom said goodbye from, with all the grace and dignity, love and care she deserved.
