2023 KINDRED FOUNDATION GRANT

Oak Ridges Hospice is thrilled to share that we are one of the recipients of the 2023 Kindred Foundation Grant! With this grant, we have been able to expand our offerings to better support our residents and their loved ones.

The financial support from the Kindred Grant made it possible for us to purchase new musical instruments that enhance our Music Therapy offerings. We were also able to purchase a stethoscope that records heart beats, adding another option for families to create a lasting memory from their loved one.

Additionally, with the support of the Kindred Foundation, we were able to host a series of workshops aimed at supporting the loved ones of past residents. Dubbed the 'What's Next' workshop series, topics ranged from Cooking for One to Social and Community Engagement, Financial Planning, and more. These workshops shared practical tips and information for adjusting to life after losing someone. The funds from this grant also support the ongoing work that our Supportive Care Counsellor, Hannah Carlson, is doing to support our residents and their loved ones through the end-of-life journey, further strengthening our commitment to compassionate care.

Having lost my Dad eleven years ago to cancer, I understand loss and the tremendous grief that it carries. If I can make someone's experience just a little bit easier, that's what I am looking forward to the most.

Soup! Who doesn't love a good bowl of soup? There is something comforting about curling up on the couch with a warm bowl of hearty soup. Soup is versatile, its flexible, and you can get creative! My partner and I make a lot of soup from scratch at home, with our favourites being thirteen-bean and hearty vegetable. I am excited to show off my soup skills here at the hospice.

If I had a superpower, it would be to save all the homeless dogs out there. I'm an animal lover at heart and my partner and I have often talked about how we'd love to have a little hobby farm full of rescued dogs.


RIGHT AT HOME REALTY ART AUCTION

Barara Muffins

Ingredients:


- 5 Large Ripe Bananas
- 11/4 cups sugar
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2/3 cup melted margarine
- 3 cups flour
- 2 tsps. baking soda
- 2 tsps. baking powder
- Optional: Approx. 1 1/2 cups blueberries or cranberries

*Try adding 1 cup of Butterscotch or chocolate chips for added sweetness!"

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375F
- 2. Mash bananas, add sugar, lightly beaten eggs. Mix well.
- 3. Add melted margarine, mix well.
- 4. Add all dry ingredients, sift together.
- 5. Add your choice of berries and/or chips, mix well.
- 6. Bake at 375F for 20-25 mins
